Skiers by the thousands are expected to flock to ski areas throughout Michigan tomorrow for the long New Year's weekend.

Here is a report from various ski areas:

Houghton Lake Snow Bowl near Houghton Lake — Three inch base with two inches of medium powder. Skiing fair to good.

Mio Mountain near Mio — Two inch base with four to five inches of fresh snow. Snowing. Skiing excellent.

Skyline near Roscommon—Four inch base with three inches of snow. Snowing. Skiing excellent.

Sheridan Valley, Woodridge Ski Area and Silver Beach Ski Resort, all near Lewiston—Six inch heavy snow. Skiing good.

Grayling Sports Park, Lovell Winter Playland and Lake Valley Ski Resort, all near Grayling—Four inch base with three inches of new snow. Skiing good.

Snow Valley, Otsego Ski Club, Waters Ski Village, Sylvan Knob Au Sable Range and Ski Club, Gay El Rancho Ski Club, all near Gaylord—Six to eight inch packed base with four inches of new settled powder. Snowing. Skiing good.

The West Michigan Tourist and Resort Assn. reported for the following reports:

Avalanche at Boyne City—Two-inch base, two-inch new, wet snow. Skiing very good.

Boyne Mountain at Boyne Falls—Two-inch new snow. Skiing fair to good.

Caberfae at Cadillac—Two-inch granular base. One to two-inch powder. Skiing fair to good.

Echo Valley at Kalamazoo—Open when weather becomes favorable.

Harbor Highlands at Harbor Springs—Six-inch base, two-inch new snow. Skiing fair.

Holiday Hills at Traverse City—Some base, two-inch new snow. Skiing fair. Will be open over weekend and through and including New Years.

Hickory Hills at Traverse City—Will open when weather becomes favorable.

Lake Valley Resort at Kalkaska—Skiing good to excellent.

Manistee Ski Area—Two-inch base, one inch of light snow. Skiing good.

Missaukee Mountain at Lake City—Four-inch base, one inch of powder. Skiing good.
