Bull Run Ski Area Open House at New Chalet This Sunday

The handsome new chalet at the Bull Run ski Area will be open for public inspection at an open house from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 26. The ski facility is located two miles west of Boscobel on hwy. 133, at the Leon Glasbrenner farm.

The chalet, built as a project by the VTAE school in Fennimore, agricultural buildings division, is equipped with rustic furniture and lies near the foot of one of the ski runs. Close by is the new rope tow that will carry skiers to the top of the big hill.

Coffee and hot chocolate will be served at the chalet and there will be skis and equipment on display. Season

tickets are also being sold for the coming ski season.

The entire ski area will be open for inspection for those who want to climb the ski runs and obtain the breathtaking view from the top of "Bull Run."

Bull Run is being operated by three Boscobel teachers, Leon Glasbrenner, Gary Novinska and Jerald Fitzgerald, who have done most of the work themselves. A course titled "Skiing for Fun" will be taught at Bull Run later this year through the VTAE school. Gary and Emma Novinska will be the instructors (see story on page 1, sec. 2).
