

Steamboat Rock Hosts Jamboree

STEAMBOAT ROCK — The first annual all-Iowa Winter Sports jamboree has been set for Saturday, Feb. 20, here in scenic Hardin county. The full day of exciting events includes skiing, tobogganning, ice skating and snowmobile safaris. Lt. Gov. Roger Jepsen will attend.

All events will be at the Iowa River Conservation and Improvement club on the Iowa river. The club has two rope tows, one for skiers and one for sledders. The ski slope has a good packed base to a depth of 30 inches. There are bright lights for night skiing and sledging.

The snowmobile safaris will be guided trail rides. The three runs of the safari begin at 2, 3:30 and 7 p.m.
