

Winter Jamboree at Steamboat Rock Saturday, Jan. 27

A greatly expanded All Iowa Winter Sports Jamboree has been set for Saturday, January 27, 1973, at Steamboat Rock. Snowmobile safaris - guided trail rides - are scheduled for 10:30 a. m., 2:00 p. m., and 7:00 p. m. Other featured events are a "Mini" Snow Sculpture Contest, a skating race, a ski race, and tubing. Open skiing, skating, and tobogganing are offered from 9:00 a. m. - 10:30 p. m.

FAMILY FUN

The Winter Jamboree features all winter sports and the focus is on family fun. The snowmobile safaris are guided trail rides in the scenic Iowa River and Pine Lake areas. "Tubing" is a snowmobile associated sport that young and old can enjoy. A huge tractor inner tube is pulled behind a snowmobile to give tube passengers fun and thrills.

MINI SCULPTURE UNIQUE

The Mini Snow Sculpture Contest is unique to the Winter Jamboree. It is believed to be the only winter carnival in the world featuring such a contest. Entries can measure no larger than 2 feet by 2 feet. Plaques will be given in three divisions: elementary (kindergarten - 6th), intermediate (7th-12th grades), and adult. Entry fee is \$1.00.

Loving cups are presented to the winners of the Capitol Cup Races in skiing and skating. Surprise sports award certificates are presented to snowmobilers, skiers and skaters. These certificates are based on sportsmanship as well as skill.

Gate prizes include a deluxe Farm King ham, a handmade shawl, and an elephant bed spread.

SNOW PRINCESS

New this year will be the crowning of the Jamboree Snow Princess at the evening meal. The Princess will be chosen on the basis of skill in winter sports, personality and beauty by three judges at the Jamboree. The Princess must be single and between the ages of 14 and 25.
