

Many Try Out Skis; Tows In Operation

With ideal weather and snow conditions prevailing hundreds of skiers are gathering daily at the Gladstone Sports Park on the Days River to enjoy the sport.

Both ski tows were assembled and tested this week and will be in operation today, it is announced by Wm. S. Skellenger, club president.

The front hill at the location of the tow has been graded to allow a more gradual and even ascent while the tow on the bowl has been moved to the westward a short distance in order to be more convenient for the riders.

In its new location skiers merely have to turn around after a ride down hill and the terrain to the foot of the tow will still be slightly down grade.

Both tows have been speeded up to some extent which will prove an advantage to skiers.

New type floodlights have been placed on several of the slopes and the lighting system is far superior to that previously used, it is announced by Mr. Skellenger.

The new area in Lamberg's grove which has been opened up by the United States Forest Service is proving very popular and undoubtedly a ski tow will be erected in that area at some future date.

The new development includes pan slides for children, small ski slides and a toboggan run, difficult runs for experienced skiers and cross-country ski trails.

The road from the highway to the clubhouse has not been blowed so persons are requested to leave this autos at the gate and walk the short distance. This will preclude any possibility of getting stuck.
