

GVSC Plans Winter Carnival

Grand Valley State College is planning their first winter carnival the week of Feb. 21.

On Feb. 20, all campus organizations may begin their snow sculpture entries. On Monday, there will be open skiing and tobogganing on the ski slopes in the evening.

On Tuesday, the winter carnival queen contestants will be presented in Lake Huron Hall (4 p.m.). In the evening, there will again be open skiing and tobogganing.

ON THE 23RD, there will be a powder puff bowl football game between Muskegon House and Wayne House of the Grand Valley apartments. This will be held at 3 p.m. in the intra-mural field. The feature of the evening will be a talent show, sponsored by the GVSC singers in the Grand Traverse Room of Lake Michigan Hall. This will start at 7:30 p.m.

At 9 p.m., the winter carnival queen will be crowned in Lake Huron Hall.

On Thursday, President Zumberge will show slides and lecture about Antarctica. It will start at 4 p.m. and be held in Lake Superior Hall. That evening will feature the opening night of the play, "The Knight of the Burning Pestle" by Les Visage.

For those not attending the play, there will be an informal jam session at Seidman House.

On Friday, all snow sculpture work must be completed, and will be judged. At 3 p.m. there will be judging of the beard contest, and announcement of the winners in the snow sculpture.

Saturday will feature a dog sled contest (students pulling other students on toboggans) at the Crew House at 9 a.m. At 12:30 a basketball game between Grand Valley State College and Aquinas J.V. will be held in the West Catholic Gymnasium in Grand Rapids.

The culmination of the carnival will be held Saturday night, with a dance from 9 p.m. to 12:30 p.m. At this time, all awards will be presented.
