



Grand Valley State Has New, Improved Winter Sports Facilities

Looking forward to a go down Grand Valley State College's improved ski hill facilities is Gloria Moes, freshman from Lambertville. The college has completed improvements at its winter sports area on campus which now contains a new ice skating rink; ample parking lot; a new, smooth-riding ski tow, and improvements in the college's relocated A-frame ski chalet.

The ski hill, regraded, widened and lengthened this fall, provides runs of more than 550 feet and a drop of more than 100 feet. A small A-frame at the top of the rope tow

will be manned by college personnel for tow service and for first aid if needed.

Newly-installed 31,000-watt floodlights will permit evening use of the rink and hill. The facilities not only provide recreation for members of the college community but also are used extensively for physical education classes. Designer and supervisor of the winter sports area improvements was GVSC's utilities and maintenance supervisor, Purl A. Cobb of Hudsonville.
