

Quarter Mile Long; Will Have Lights, Electric Lift, Huts

A ski and toboggan slide, built by members of the Port Huron Lions club on a hill five miles northwest of Wadhams, is expected to be ready for use by the first snow fall.

Work has been progressing on the slope, located on the property of C. D. Wolfe, Abbottsford road, since early September.

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FOUR 1,500-WATT floodlights were installed Sunday to illuminate the quarter mile slope which extends from Abbottsford road to the valley of Black river, nearly 200 feet below.

An electric lift to carry skiers and tobogganists to the top of the hill will soon be installed and buildings will be constructed where skiers may buy hot coffee and warm their feet.

Work began in September when members of the Lions club began clearing brush from the site. Since then they have worked nearly every Sunday preparing the slide.

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DR. E. E. SCHULTE, general chairman of the project, said that the slide would be open to all who wished to use it although a nominal fee may be charged to help finance the cost of the lift and floodlighting.

George W. Everson was in charge of the installation of floodlights. Samuel Eusey is chairman of the building committee. John Wirtz will supervise the installation of the lift. S. M. "Tim" Saunders is in charge of general production; Roland Backhurst, material procurement, and George Henderson, publicity.
