

Piling Snow Is Welcomed Here By Outdoormen

Accelerated by piling snow and ideal temperatures, the enthusiasm of winter sports fans ran high today in anticipation of a full weekend of activities.

Skating, skiing, tobogganning, ice-boating and fishing are certain to attract big crowds to Western Michigan's winter sports centers providing the weather holds.

At the Greater Muskegon Ski club course in Muskegon State park, the tow will be in operation Saturday and Sunday from 10 a. m. until dark. A full throng of skiers and spectators is anticipated on both days by Rex Sheathelm, club president. There is a warming shelter near the run.

The toboggan course at the state park, not being supervised this season by park rangers because of an inadequate staff, also is certain to draw over the weekend, although it is not in particularly good shape. Nick Trierweiler, Muskegon park superintendent, said that he was seeking a responsible group to volunteer to keep the slide in operating condition.

The popularity of all local ice rinks is expected to be heightened over the weekend. At most centers, the ice is reported in top condition and it is planned to flood them tonight.

The ice-fishing season, nearing its peak on Muskegon, Bear and other lakes in the area, should see hundreds of men and women in action with hooks and lines.
