

# Club Boosts Skiing for Amateurs

The Moon Valley Ski Club will hold its first meeting next Tuesday, November 15 at 8 p.m. at the West hotel. The officers of the club will explain the program for the coming season. George Tallon, secretary of the club, will tell about the club's system of classifying skiers according to ability.

An invitation to all skiers interested in downhill skiing to attend the meeting, was extended by Harry Tyson, president of the club.

Improvements at Moon Valley include the installation of a complete new gasoline motor powered ski tow capable of carrying 15 to 20 skiers up at a time, uniform grading of the tow track, clearing new trails and smoothing open slopes, and the addition of a new building to serve hot refreshments.

Mr. Tallon stated yesterday that the club's program will be attractive to both beginners and experts, because of the classification system which divides skiers according to ability. "Tests patterned after those used by the British Ski Club will be used to classify skiers," Mr. Tallon said. These tests will benefit skiers by furnishing them with a definite goal for the improvement of their ability.
