WASHINGTON (AP) — President Johnson told his chief disarmament negotiator Thursday he "has been encouraged by developments — over the past year," and hopes for further progress at news talks in Geneva.

Johnson, meeting with Director William C. Foster of the Arms Control and Disarmament Agency, restated his position "that the United States will take every opportunity to seek out possible new areas for agreement."

Foster will head the American delegation at a 17-nation conference in Geneva beginning Jan. 21. He told newsmen he thought a "change in the state of mind" in American-Soviet relations during the past year should make further progress possible.
