

WINTER SPORTS GET A BIG PLAY OVER WEEK-END

Skiing, Skating and Tobogganing to the Front

With the arrival of plenty of snow and lower temperatures, various branches of winter sports got off to a flying start Sunday when all scenes of such activities were crowded with enthusiasts.

A large number of ski parties and tobogganers gathered at the Tomahawk Lake country club course southeast of the city and put in a lively day on fast courses featured in that vicinity, and at Trojan some 150 people negotiated the three-mile ski trail from the skyline mining camp to Lost Camp. Others made use of the numerous ski and toboggan slides thruout this section of the Hills which require varying degrees of experience and skill.

The big ice skating rink at Blacktail operated by the Lead American Legion post, is drawing large crowds of skaters both afternoon and evenings, and is easily the outstanding recreation spot of this part of the country. Ice at the rink, excellent at all times, was in perfect condition over the week-end and hundreds derived maximum enjoyment at all sessions. The rink is open from 2 until 4 o'clock each afternoon, and from 7:30 until 10 o'clock at night.

A large, warm change room is provided skaters, with rest rooms for men and women. A "hot-dog" lunch counter is in operation and skate sharpening on a latest type machine is available to patrons. Music for skating is provided by several loudspeakers placed in the walls of the rink and a balcony around in the building takes care of spectators.
